Ricardo Sternberg was born in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil in 1948 and moved to the United States with his family when he was litteen. He received a B.A. in English literature from UC Riverside and a M.A. and Ph.D. from UCIA. Between 1975 and 1978, he was a Junior Fellow with the Society of Fellows at Harvard University. His poetry has been published in magazines such as The Paris Review, The Hation, Poetry (Chicago), Descant, American Poetry Review, The Virginia Quarterly and Ploughshares. Vehicule Press (Montreall published The Invention of Honey (1990, republished 1990), Map of Dreams (1993) and McGill-Queen's University Press published Bamboo Church (2003, republished 2006). Cyclops Press released a CO of his readings, Blindsight, in 1998. Some Dance, his fourth collection, was published by McGill-Queen's University Press in April of 2014. He has written a book on the poet Carlos Drummond de Andrade, The Unquiot Self, and has multished widely on Brazilian and Portugues eliterature.

A native of Arizona, Nicolar Shumway graduated with highest honors from BYU in 1969 with majors in Spanish and Music. He completed his MA in 1971 and PhD in 1976 at UCLA with concentrations in Hispanic literatures and linguistics. After receiving his doctorate, he taught at Pepperdien University, Indiana University Morthwest, Vale University and the University and for these years and disected the Spanish language program for eight. In 1987, he received tenure at Yale and was promoted to Full Professor in 1992. After fourteen years at Yale, he accepted an appointment in 1993 at the University of Texas at Austin as the Tomás Rivers Regents Professor of Spanish. Two years later he became director of the UT Teress Lozano Long Institute of Latin American Studies, a position he held for eleven years. From 2008 to 2010, he served as Chair of the UT Department of Spanish and Portuguese. In July of 2010, he became Dean of Humanities and the Frances Moody Newman Professor of Humanities at Rice University. In 2013, he received an honorary doctorate from the Universidad de San Pablo in Tucumán, Argentina.

His scholarship explores Letin-American history and culture with particular emphasis on Argentina, Brazil and Mosico. His best known book, The Invention of Argentina, was selected by The New York Times as "a notable book of the year" and received Honoratelia Mention for the Bruce Wood Book Award of the Latin American Studies Association. The book is currently available in English, Spanish and Portuguese, in 2011, he published a second book on Argentina titled Historia personal de una pasión argentina.


Fluent in Spanish and Portuguese, Shumway has held visiting appointments at the Universidade de São Paulo in Brazill and at two Argentine universities, the Universidad de San Andrés and the Universidad Torcuato di Tella, both in Buenos Aires. Shumway has received two Fubbight appointments, one se a Researcher/Teacher in Brazil and another as a Sonior Specialist in American Studies in Argentina. A popular speaker, he has lectured at universities throughout the Americas and Europe and has been featured several times by the Houston World Affairs Council and the Houston Forum.

In addition to his academic life, Shumway performs as a singer, planist, organist, and choir director. During his time as a graduate student at UCLA, he sang with the Los Angeles Master Chorale.


