

MEXICAN STUDIES MINOR

PREREQUISITES: To declare the Mexican Studies minor, students must have an overall GPA of 2.0, have completed or received credit equivalent to Spanish 5, and must meet with the Department Counselor. All lower division courses must also be completed before declaring the minor. All courses must be taken for a letter grade and students **must obtain at least a "C"** in *all courses towards the minor*. Successful completion of the minor is indicated on the transcript and diploma.
